2. Is not a past recipient of the award.
3. Was nominated prior to the closing date of the award process.
4. Nominations should describe the extent to which the person achieved any/all of the following
 - Strengthened community partnerships
 - Increased the number or quality of services to families
 - Helped students with special needs to become accepted or reach new goals
 - Helped other parents to develop stronger leadership roles
 - Worked to make sure at-risk children/youth are mentored and supported

1. Has a child with a disability (any) between the ages of birth to twenty-six.
2. Exemplifies or makes an outstanding contribution as a parent who demonstrates effective parent involvement

Achievement

1. Is a professional working in ND in special education; regular education, Title I or as a related service specialist.
